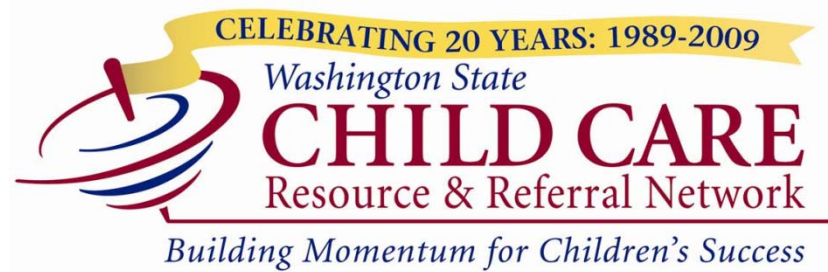

INTRODUCTION

History and Background

The Washington State Child Care Resource & Referral Network (CCR&R Network) is a statewide 501(c)(3) membership organization created in 1989 to implement a strong community-based network for delivering local child care resource and referral (CCR&R) services to families and caregivers throughout Washington. In 1985, the Governor's Task Force on Child Care recommended the creation of community-based CCR&R services in Washington. In 1986, the recommendation was put into statute (RCW 74.13.0903).

Organizational Structure

In 1987, five organizations in local communities received federal planning grants to develop CCR&R programs. From an initial five programs, the CCR&R Network grew to 18 local CCR&Rs serving the entire state population. In 2005, the CCR&R Network, in partnership with the State of Washington and private funders, embarked on a system-wide transformation process intended to streamline and ensure equitable CCR&R services in every community of the state. This process culminated in August of 2009. The CCR&R Network now serves as a managing network that contracts with 11 local CCR&R programs. The CCR&R Network and local programs collectively employ about 100 staff (55 FTEs) to provide core services statewide. Local CCR&R staff work out of 20 locations across the state, ensuring a statewide, community-based presence. A complete list of the CCR&R Network members follows this section.

Mission

The mission of the CCR&R Network is *to support families and caregivers, shape policy, and build communities that promote the learning and development of all children and youth in Washington through a strong statewide network of local child care resource and referral programs.*

To fulfill this mission, the CCR&R Network office:

- Supports locally-based child care resource and referral member programs through providing telephone and onsite technical assistance, facilitating regular sharing of best practices in the field, training CCR&R program staff, writing grants and negotiating contracts, and coordinating and staffing CCR&R Network meetings;
- Collects, analyzes and disseminates data on child care supply and demand, child care rates, demographic trends in child care, and basic community child care needs assessments;
- Staffs a statewide toll-free phone line for anyone seeking referrals or other information about child care;

- Leverages private and public dollars for the development and statewide replication of a wide variety of family and child care provider programs in the areas of provider training and family support;
- Advocates for quality child care policy and funding at state, regional and federal levels;
- Coordinates efforts with other early childhood and afterschool care organizations in the state through serving on statewide committees and task forces;
- Serves as a voice for families and child care providers on a national level; and
- Works with employers to find solutions for increased quality child care.

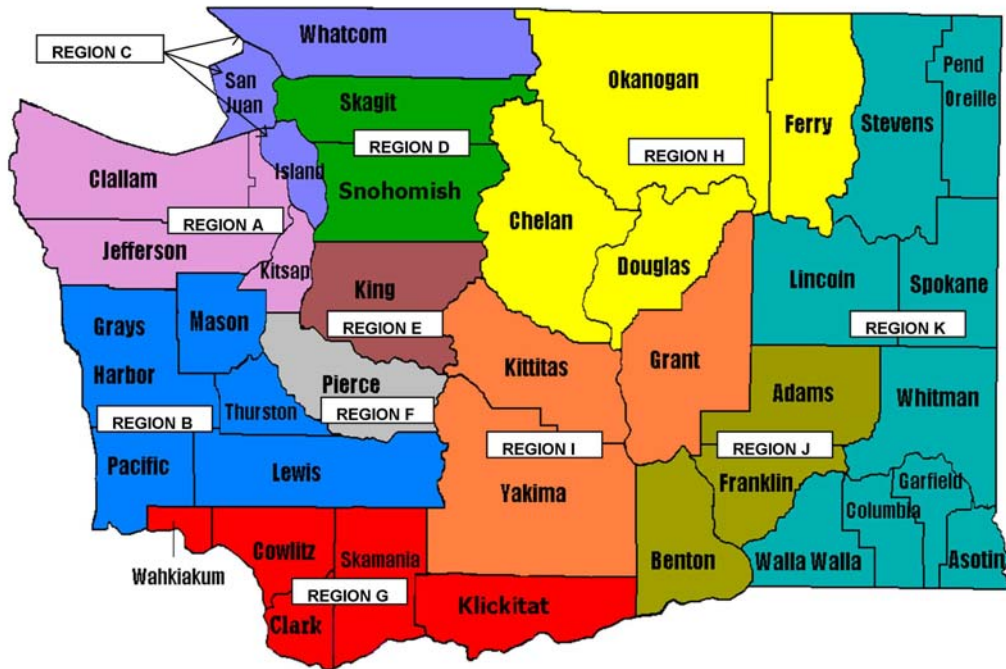
Funding of the CCR&R Network and Local CCR&R Programs

The CCR&R Network is a public/private partnership that receives funding from a variety of sources. In 2009, our funding stream included the federal Child Care Development Block Grant, Washington State Department of Early Learning and Department of Health, corporate and foundation grants, fees for service, membership dues, and individual donations. Similarly, the local CCR&R programs receive funding from the CCR&R Network and local funding sources such as federal and local government grants, United Ways, corporations and charitable organizations and foundations which vary from community to community.

Methodology for this Report

Local CCR&R Network member programs collect data from families and providers in order to provide services. All CCR&Rs use the same proprietary data system and software which includes standardized data fields. CCR&R Network staff monitor the data to ensure quality and consistency, and the data is cleaned to meet CCR&R Network standards before reports are produced.

ABOUT THIS REPORT

The information contained in this report details child care referral statistics that the CCR&R Network gathered in 2009 and comparative statistics for the years 2005 through 2009. Client referral statistics reflect only the number of families that accessed the CCR&R Network's referral services and thus do not represent the state's total child care needs. Provider statistics include licensed child care facilities in all of the state's 39 counties as of December 2009, but the rate data was calculated as of June 30, 2009.

Explanation of Terms:

"Calls and Contacts" or "Calls" are incoming requests (in person, by phone and/or by email) to local CCR&R offices from parents, providers and community members.

"Client" refers to parents, guardians, foster parents and family members who contact CCR&R programs for assistance.

"Duplicate Call" or "Duplicate Search" refers to a search performed for a client within 10 months of the original referral search, unless the family has already been counted as a new client in that calendar year.

"Enhanced Referral" is a contracted service with employers and other agencies to provide additional assistance with client's child care search.

"Facilities" refers to licensed family child care (FCC) homes, exempt school-age programs, and/or licensed child care centers.

"Internet Searches" are searches done by clients without assistance from agency counselors. These are the total number times the internet was used for child care provider searches.

"Providers" refers to licensed family child care (FCC) homes, exempt school-age programs, and/or licensed center child care facilities.

"Provider Technical Assistance" refers to child care provider requests for information and assistance from CCR&R staff. Examples of technical assistance requests include, but are not limited to: what trainings are available and how to access them, questions about developmentally appropriate practice, information on accessing the child care subsidy system, and referrals to other community resources.

"Public Referral Call" or "Referral Search" is the process of providing clients with referrals to licensed child care programs. A referral includes contact and program information that matches parent needs and information about selecting quality care.

"Slots" refers to spaces in a licensed facility (potential capacity, not actual enrollment).

SECTION 1

Annual Child Care Client Activity

January 1 to December 31, 2009

ANALYSIS OF CLIENT TRENDS

NOTE: The analysis presented here is based on data from both Section 1, Annual Child Care Client Activity and Section 2, Client Activities, 2005-2009.

Overview

In contrast to the previous four-year period, the overall demand for child care referrals decreased in 2009. This decline was demonstrated by fewer client contacts in all call categories. The decline in requests from clients may be an indicator of the current economic downturn. Specifically, the CCR&R Network processed 9,654 (33%) fewer public referral calls, 654 (24%) fewer enhanced referrals, and 12,133 (16%) fewer calls for help with other, non-referral, child issues (technical assistance). However, there were 4,394 internet searches between July and December (an average of 732 searches a month) – a new service available to all counties starting in July. It is important to know that for clients using the internet, administrative processing was first needed to set up the account. Overall, counting the internet searches, the CCR&R Network showed a 17% decrease in the number of total referrals (or 18,047 fewer than in 2008). To summarize 2009, CCR&R Network member programs:

- Answered 90,908 total queries either by counselor or electronically;
- Processed 21,822 referral calls;
- Provided referrals for 17,908 families with 25,425 children; and of those,
- Assisted 10,190 known low-income families with 15,695 children.

It should be noted that the 387 clients using Child Care Resource's internet web site for self-referrals in King County did not report any child information; while these families are reflected in the total number of families, their contribution to the total number of children is unknown and therefore not included. The CCR&R Network estimates that the total number of children served statewide would be slightly less than 26,000 if these King County children were included. As a result, this slightly skews the relationship between number of families and number of children.

In 2009, the 731 children with special needs referred represented a decrease of 139 children (16%) from 2008. However, this information was not available from internet clients, which may have slightly affected the decline.

Trend in Ages of Children Referred

Between 2005 and 2009, there was little variation across age categories for the children referred to services. By category, the average percent of total referrals in 2009 were:

- Schoolage (Ages 5+) 32%
- Preschool Age (Ages 3 & 4) 21%
- Toddlers (Ages 1 & 2) 27%
- Infants (Less than 1 year old) 21%

SUMMARY OF 2009 CLIENT DATA

Type of Calls

The local member agencies processed a total of 90,908 calls in 2009, a decrease of 18,048 calls from 2008. This represents a 17% decline. The type of service offered breaks down as follows:

- 19,806 (24%) public child care referral searches
- 2,016 (2%) enhanced child care referral searches
- 4,394 (5%) internet searches for child care (11% of July-Dec totals)
- 64,692 (71%) technical assistance calls/contacts¹

Compared to 2008, the number of public referral calls decreased 33% (by 9,654), while the number of enhanced referral calls decreased 24% (by 654). The number of technical assistance calls/contacts decreased 16% (by 12,133) compared with 2008. Internet searches for child care is a new service that began in July.

Families

In 2009, the local CCR&R programs provided referrals for 17,908 families, which was 4,927 fewer than last year. This figure includes the 2,205 families doing self-referrals using the internet (12% of families referred; 24% of families referred between July and December).

The following data summarizes responses from the 14,053 families who answered our profile questions. This represents 78% of all families referred and excludes most internet clients and others who did not answer the profile questions. Characteristics of these families are as follows:

- Low-income families represent over half (57% or 10,190) of all families referred
- A little less than half (49% or 6,909) are single-parent families.
- A slight majority (51% or 7,144) are two-parent families.

Children

The local CCR&R programs provided referrals for 25,425 children in 2009. This represented 6,863 (21%) fewer referrals than in the prior year. Again, this does not include all the children of King County's self-referred Internet clients.²

¹ Under the category of "Technical Assistance Calls/Contacts" the number of families and children are not reported separately. The number of calls and contacts indicate that the services provided by the local CCR&Rs go well beyond their core referral service.

² Based on the ratio of families to children in King County, an estimated 527 additional children were referred for these clients.

Ages of Children Served

Of those children whose ages were reported (percentages are rounded):

- 20% were infants (less than 1 year of age)
- 29% were toddlers (ages 1 thru 2.5 years)
- 21% were preschoolers (ages 2.6 thru 4 years)
- 29% were school age (ages 5 years and older)

Low-Income and Subsidy Requests

While 62% (15, 695) of families receiving referrals were low-income, 56% (14,156) of the children referred by the CCR&R Network qualified for a child care subsidy or requested providers who accept subsidies.

Special Needs

Consistent with the overall decline in referrals, the number of referred children with special needs decreased from 870 in 2008 to 731 in 2009. Despite this numeric decline, about the same proportion (2.9%) of children with special needs were referred.

ADDITIONAL NOTES ON CLIENT DATA

The information in this report presents part of a picture of Washington State's child care demand, specifically the needs of those families who used CCR&R Network services to find care for their children. *Total demand* would also include those families who find child care without using CCR&R services, families who currently have children in care and families who do not access care. In addition to the limitations of the data, the following comments about the reported child care demand information are important for proper interpretation of the data presented in this report.

TYPE OF CARE REQUESTED

More than one type of care may be acceptable to the client receiving referrals. For example, a parent may ask for both center and family child care options. In this case, both center and family child care requests would be checked in the database and tallied accordingly. All requests are individually counted. Therefore the requests by type of care always add up to more than the number of referral searches.

INTERNET SERVICE AVAILABLE FOR ALL COUNTIES STARTING JULY 2009

Internet searches for child care is a new service that began in July, so the data included in this annual report is for the second six months of the year only. Also, it is too soon to determine the extent to which parents are using the internet referral process instead of, or in addition to, calling over the phone. We are currently working to identify any duplicate records.

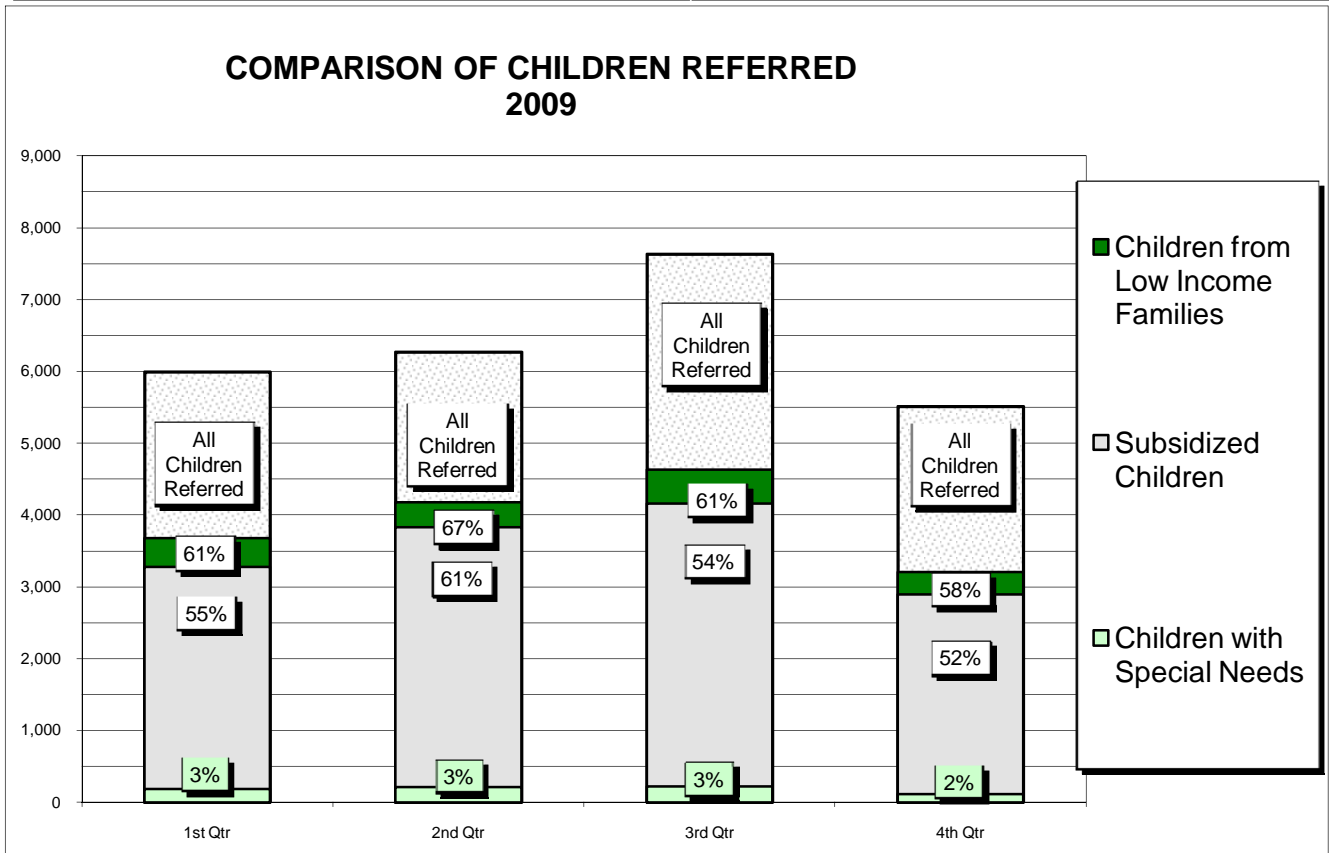
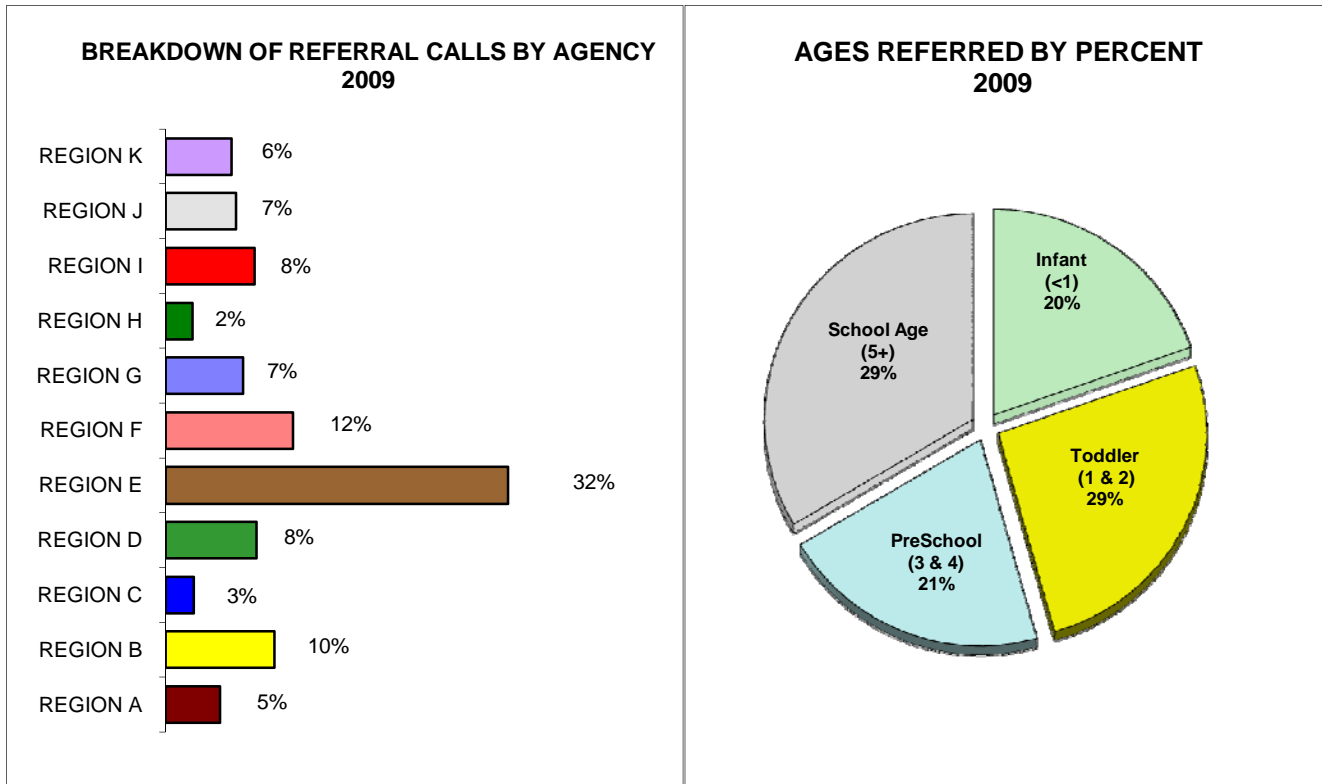

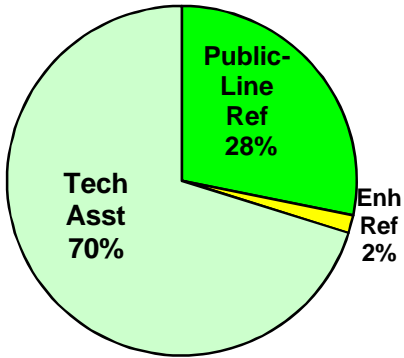

FIVE YEAR CLIENT ACTIVITY CHARTS 2005 - 2009

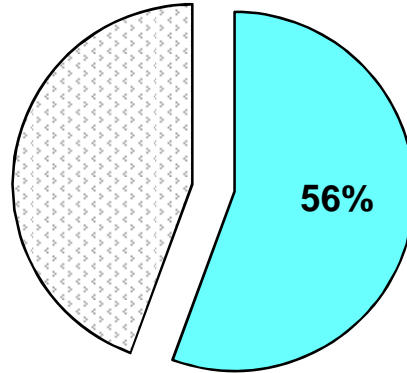
**BREAKDOWN OF CALLS

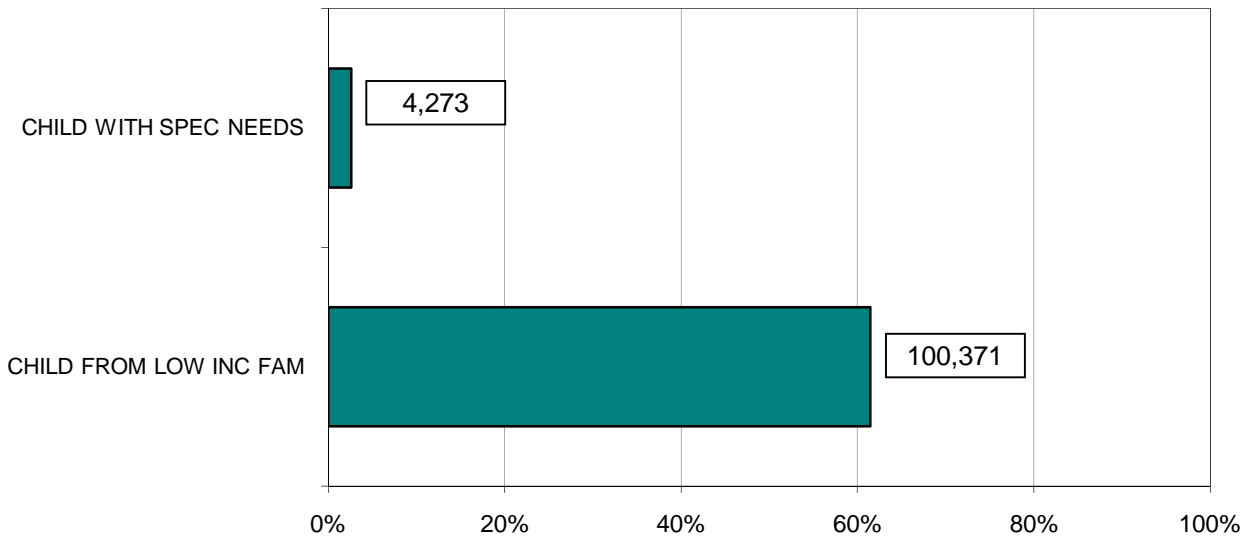

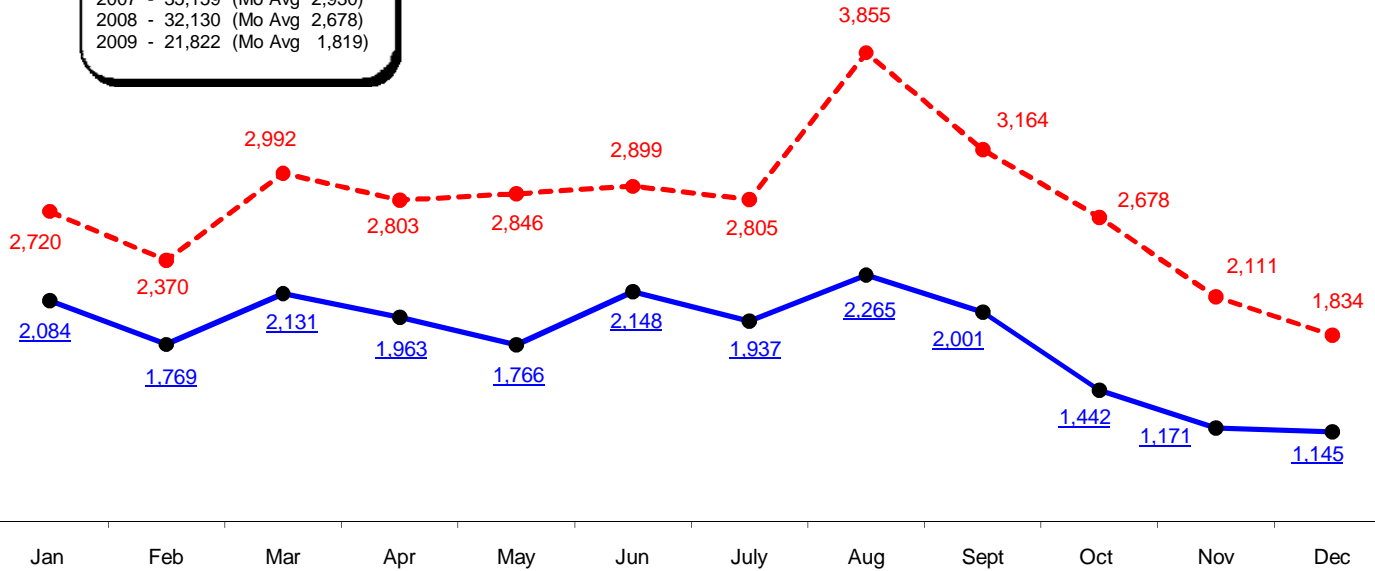
CHARTS COMPARING SERVICES BY YEAR 2005-2009

2009 REFERRAL CALLS COMPARED WITH MONTHLY AVERAGES 2004-2008

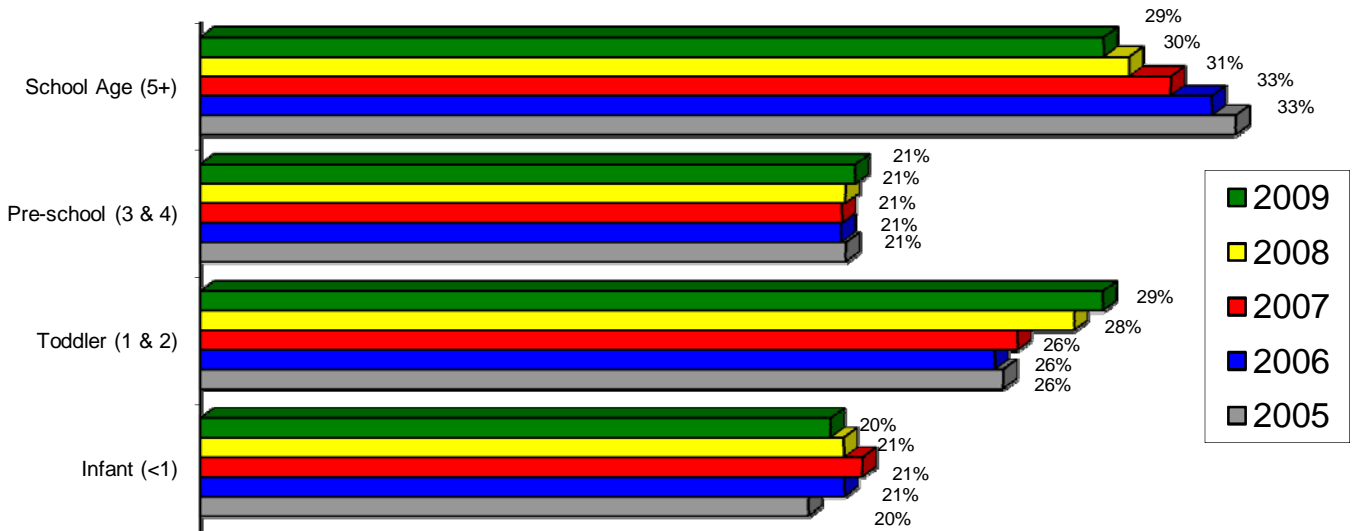

ANALYSIS OF PROVIDER TRENDS

Overview

At the end of 2009, the number of operating child care facilities was 7,584, with 177,825 child care slots. Facilities include both child care centers, family child care homes, and exempt facilities providing child care. The number of family child care (FCC) providers varies with the economy. As the economy improves, the number of FCC providers typically declines. The converse is also true: as the economy declines, the number of FCC providers often increases. However, the number of overall child care slots usually increases in a strong economy because of growth in the number of child care centers – and relatively small growth in the number of child care centers yields a relatively large growth in the number of slots.

Compared to 2008, the total number of center facilities increased by 46, the number of center slots increased by 3,148. In 2009, there were 65 more FCC facilities and 570 more slots than in 2008. This continues the FCC increase first experienced last year after 5 straight years of decreases. There were 13 fewer exempt facilities, but 130 more slots, compared to 2008. **Overall in 2009, there were 98 more facilities and 3,848 more slots than in 2008.** Compared to 2005, there has been an overall increase of 45 center facilities with 6,096 more center slots and a decline of 213 FCC facilities and loss of 1,863 slots. For family child care, this represents a 4% loss of facilities and a 4% loss of slots.

The overall decline of FCC facilities has some significant impacts on the range of choices available to parents within the licensed child care system:

1. Child care becomes more expensive overall, since center-based facilities are typically more expensive than FCC facilities;
2. Fewer child care slots are available for nonstandard-hour care;
3. Child care facilities are more concentrated in populated areas and less available in neighborhood locations and rural areas; and
4. There are fewer overall infant slots available for families to access since FCC facilities provide a majority of these slots in the system.

MEDIAN RATES OF CHILD CARE COST

The median rate of child care cost is the mid-point of the child care rates, or fees charged by licensed facilities, for that county. This means that half of the child care facilities in that county charge *the same or more than* the median rate, and the other half of the facilities charge *the same or less than* the median rate. Counties with only a few facilities can show wide fluctuation in median rates from year to year, even decreasing in some cases. Therefore, it is critical to interpret the median rates and the potential variation with this in mind.

Statewide, the median rates for child care center facilities increased across all four age categories:

- 3% for infants;
- 2% for toddlers;
- 1% for preschoolers; and
- 4% for school-age children.

During the prior three years, there have been similar rate increases among center facilities for all four age categories. Between 2007 and 2009, the average rates charged by centers increased 4% for infants, 4% for toddlers, 4% for preschoolers, and 4% for school-age children.

For family child care facilities (FCC), the median rates charged also increased across all age categories except infant rates:

- 0% for infants;
- 5% for toddlers;
- 3% for preschoolers; and
- 3% for school-age children.

For FCCs the rate increases of the years 2007, 2008 and 2009 averaged 3% for infants, 6% for toddlers, 4% for preschoolers, and 6% for school-age children.

Infant Care

Infant care costs the most among all the age categories. Across the state, the highest median monthly rate, or fee, for infants in center care is in King County, at \$1,235. The lowest median monthly rate for infants in center care is in Stevens County, at \$498 – this is the only county where the median infant rate is less than \$500 per month. Wahkiakum County has the next lowest median monthly rate for infants, at \$530. Among counties with more than ten centers taking infants, the lowest median monthly rates are \$618 in Chelan County and \$624 in Yakima County. For FCC facilities, King County also has the highest monthly median rate for infant care, at \$868. Snohomish and Whatcom Counties have the second highest rate at \$758, while Island and Skagit Counties have the third highest rates at \$737. Among those counties with 50 or more FCC facilities taking infants, the lowest median monthly rate of \$526 is for Grant County. The second lowest, \$542, is shared by Chelan and Douglas Counties.

School-age Care

Using a 20-hour week for schoolage care as the standard, the highest median monthly rate for center schoolage care is in Clark County, at \$459 per month; the second

highest is \$451 in King. The lowest median monthly rate for centers, \$217, is in Adams County. Among FCC facilities, Snohomish County has the highest median monthly rate, at \$412. Pierce County has the second highest rate, at \$347. The lowest median monthly rate is in Pend Oreille at \$195. Douglas and Okanogan share the second lowest at \$203.

SUMMARY OF 2009 PROVIDER DATA

At the end of 2009, the CCR&R Network's member agencies reported a total of 7,584 licensed or exempt child care facilities, 96 more than in 2008. This includes licensed centers, licensed or exempt school-age programs, and licensed family child care facilities. The breakdown of these providers is as follows:

- Centers comprised 28% (2,097) of the facilities and 70% (124,022) of the slots.
- Family child care homes comprised 71% (5,413) of the facilities and 27% (48,275) of the slots.
- Exempt programs comprised 1% (74) of the facilities and 3% of the slots (5,504).

Seventy-six percent (76%) of facilities reported accepting school-age children, 68% accept infants, 83% accept at least one kind of subsidy, and 57% reported having training or experience in the care of children with special needs. For the most part, this data is consistent with prior years, except that in 2009, 1% more facilities report accepting infants and 2% more have special-needs training and/or experience than 2008.

Provider Rates

The *50th percentile/median* and *75th percentile* facility rates are included in this report. The *median rate* (reported on pages 3-33 through 3-37) is that rate at which half of the facilities charge the same or a higher rate and the other half charge the same or a lower rate. This means that half the facilities report either the median rate or lower and the other half report either the median rate or higher. For example, if five centers are sorted by rate from lowest to highest, the rate charged by the third center in the list equals the median rate. It is more accurate to use the median rate than the average rate because averages can be distorted by a few providers who charge either an extremely low or an extremely high rate. This distortion is particularly significant in counties where there are a small number of providers.

Instead of the median rate, the *75th percentile rate* (reported on pages 3-12 through 3-20) is the rate at or below which 75% of the facilities charge. This rate is included because it was, until recently, the federal government's minimum standard for determining the maximum possible amount allowed for a provider supporting an individual child who is receiving a subsidy from the state. Some providers refuse to give their rate information to anyone except their customers. This may also skew the median rates in counties, depending on how many facilities are excluded. The report (on pages 3-21 through 3-30, and 3-33 through 3-36) details the percentages of providers from

which both the median and 75th percentile rates are derived to provide context for interpreting the rates. In calculating the percentages, only those facilities that care for children in the specified age group are used. For example, the infant rate is based on a ranking of all facilities that offer infant care. Those facilities that do not offer infant care are excluded from the infant care rate calculations.

GENERAL COMMENTS ON PROVIDER DATA

The information in this report represents provider data only for licensed centers, family child care homes and exempt facilities that operate child care programs. It does not include other exempt care such as unlicensed preschools or nanny services. However, preschools that are also licensed as centers or family child care (FCC) homes are counted.

The providers counted in this report include some who have either asked that we not refer clients to them, or who did not respond to our survey. In the latter case, we have used licensing information from the Department of Early Learning.³ All of the providers whose data is included in the report are operating legally during the time period of the report.

The number of slots reported here represents **total capacity, not total vacancies** of the facilities. The majority of these slots are already filled. The most recent Department of Early Learning Market Rate Survey, *The 2008 Child Care Rate Study: Licensed Child Care in Washington State*, showed an average 16% vacancy rate statewide.⁴

Subsidies

Because providers often accept more than one subsidy, or payment for child care services from an entity other than the child's family, "Total Unduplicated" represents the slots (pages 3-12 through 3-20) and percent of providers (page 3-21 through 3-30) that will accept any subsidy.

The numbers reflected on the spreadsheets were derived by adding the capacity of all those facilities that accept each of the listed subsidies. In practice, some providers limit the number of subsidized children they will accept. For example, *The 2008 Child Care Rate Study: Licensed Child Care in Washington State* reported that, of those centers that accepted DSHS-subsidized children, 17% limit the number they will accept.⁵ These centers report that they reserve an average of 16 slots for subsidized children.

Special Needs

The definition of "special needs" represents the number (pages 3-12 through 3-20) and percent (pages 3-21 through 3-30) of providers that have training and/or experience providing care for children with special needs.

Ages Accepted

Age ranges are reported as:

- Infants (less than 1 year);
- Toddlers (1 to 2 ½ years) (*Note: Because family child care homes have limitations on the number of children under 2 years old they can accept, and centers are limited by an adult to child ratio of 1 to 7 for children between 1 and 2½ years, a true indicator of the number of toddler slots requires the use of "under 2" for FCC and "under 2½" for centers.*);
- Preschool Children (3 and 4 years); and
- School Age Children (over 6 years) (*Note: To get a true reflection of the number slots for school age children, providers who specified their upper age limit as 5 or 6 years were not included, since the vast majority of these do not provide before- and/or after-school care.*)

Estimating a Facility's Infant/Toddler Capacity

While the infant and toddler capacities for nearly all centers in the CCR&R databases were reported, some facilities did not report this information. Therefore, the capacities for centers not reporting were estimated in the following manner based on trend data: the average percent for center infant slots in metropolitan areas was 10% of its total capacity and 13% for centers in rural areas. For toddlers, it was 22% for centers in metropolitan areas and 29% for centers in rural areas. These percentages were applied to derive an estimate for all those centers that care for infants/toddlers but did not report capacities for those ages.

Number of Slots and Overall Capacity of Licensing Child Care System

The number of slots reported here reflects the "potential" number of slots in each age category. For example, for a facility with a capacity of 5 slots that accepts both preschoolers and schoolage children, 5 slots are added in both the preschool and schoolage categories. Essentially, the facility has the option of taking either age category of child. When the slots of the two groups are added together for this facility, the total number of slots may look like 10, but there are only 5 slots available for families to access. Taking this into consideration, **the actual capacity to serve families for any of the listed age groups will be significantly less than the numbers reported here.** The "slot" number shows the age group's total number of slots only if every potential slot was filled by a child of that age group.

Provider Fees (Rates)

The 75th percentile rate (reported on pages 3-12 through 3-20) is the rate at or below which 75% of the facilities charge. This rate is included because it remains a common benchmark nationally for subsidy policy. Some providers refuse to give their rate information to anyone except their customers. This may also skew the median rates in counties, depending on how many facilities do not report. This report details (on pages 3-12 through 3-20) the percentages of providers from which the 75th percentile rates are derived to provide context for interpreting the rates. In calculating the percentages, only those facilities that care for children in the specified age group are used. For example, the infant rate is based on a ranking of all facilities that offer infant care. Those facilities that do not offer infant care are excluded from the infant care rate calculations.

Rates are reported on four different age groups: infants (0 to 11 months), toddlers (12 months to 29 months), preschoolers (29 months to 5 years), and school-age children (7 years and older). Further, the rates for these ages are individually reported for child care centers and family child care facilities.

Calculating Provider Rates

Since facilities use different bases for their rates (hourly, daily, weekly, or monthly), a common monthly rate was achieved using the following methods based on the unit in which the provider reports rates:

- **Hourly Rates** are converted first to a weekly rate by multiplying the rate by 45 hours. These derived weekly rates are then multiplied by 52 (weeks) and then divided by 12 (months). For school-age children, the hourly rate is multiplied by 20 (based on a statistical average of 4 hours per day, 5 days a week in care).
- **Daily Rates** are multiplied by 5 (days) for all age groups. These derived weekly rates are then multiplied by 52 (weeks) and then divided by 12 (months).
- **Weekly Rates** are multiplied by 52 (weeks) and then divided by 12 (months).

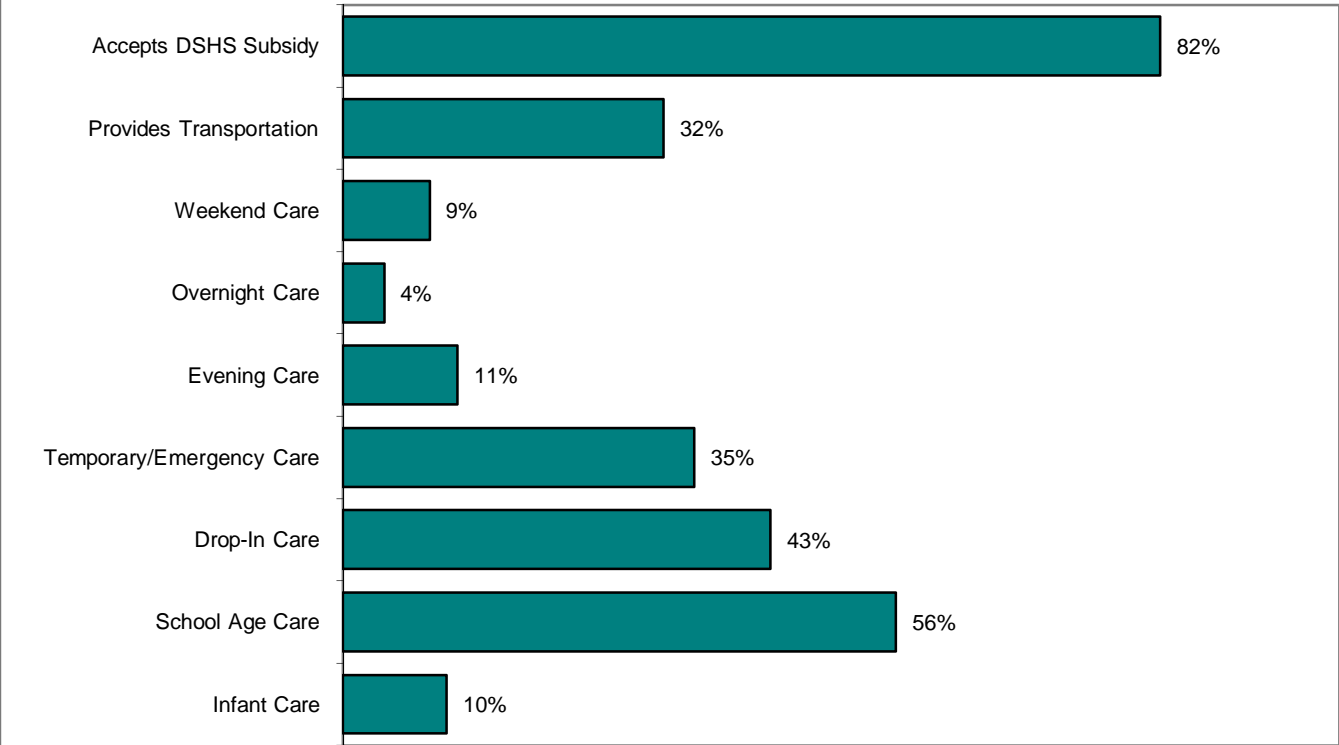

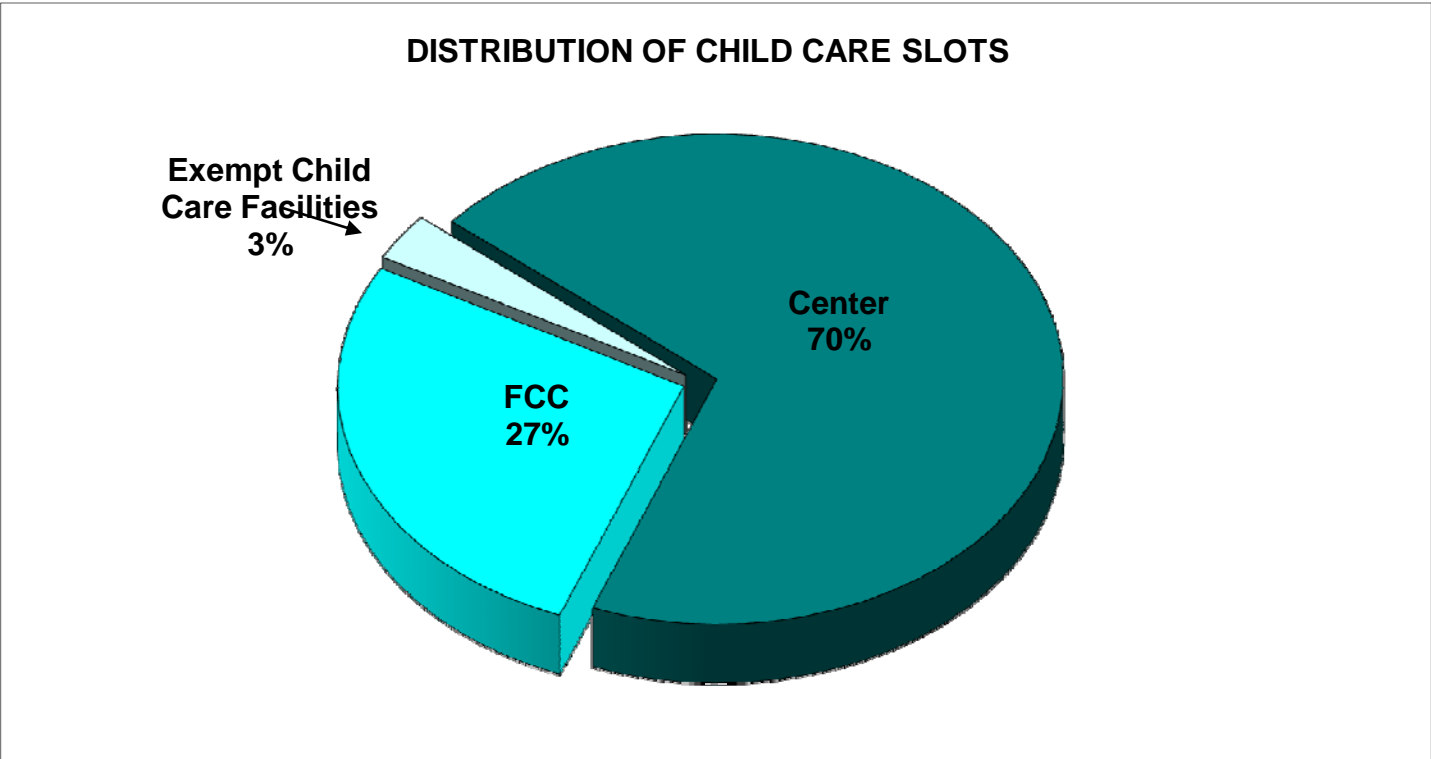

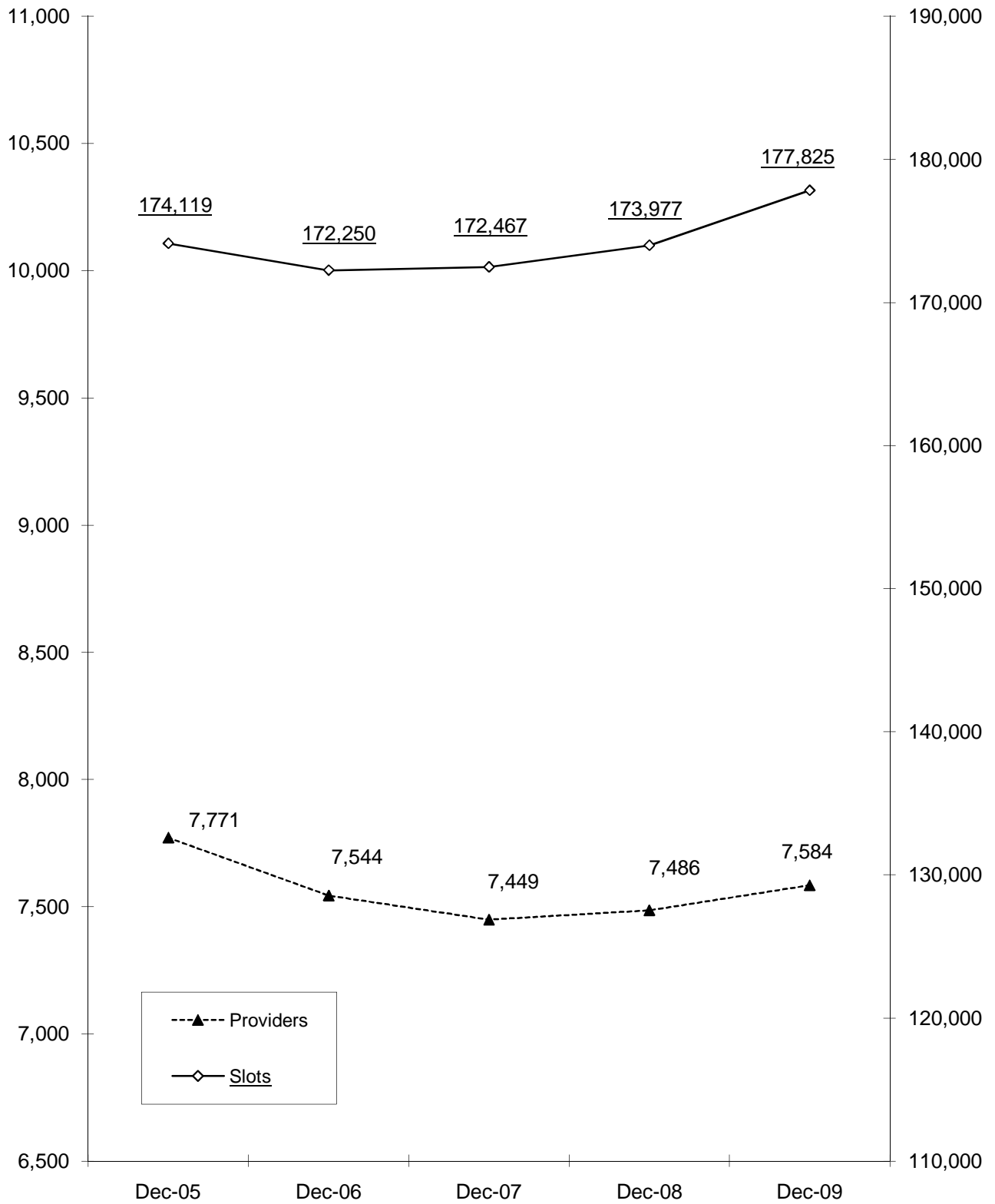
PROVIDER SERVICES IN PERCENTAGE OF SLOTS

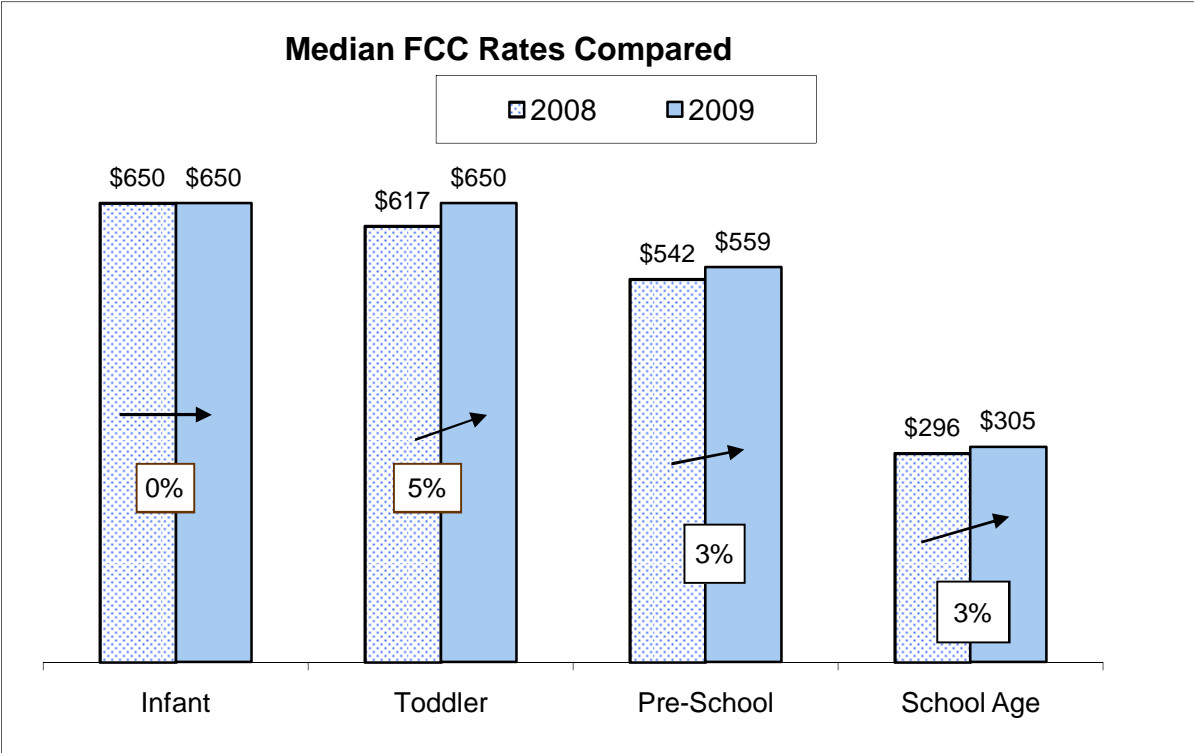
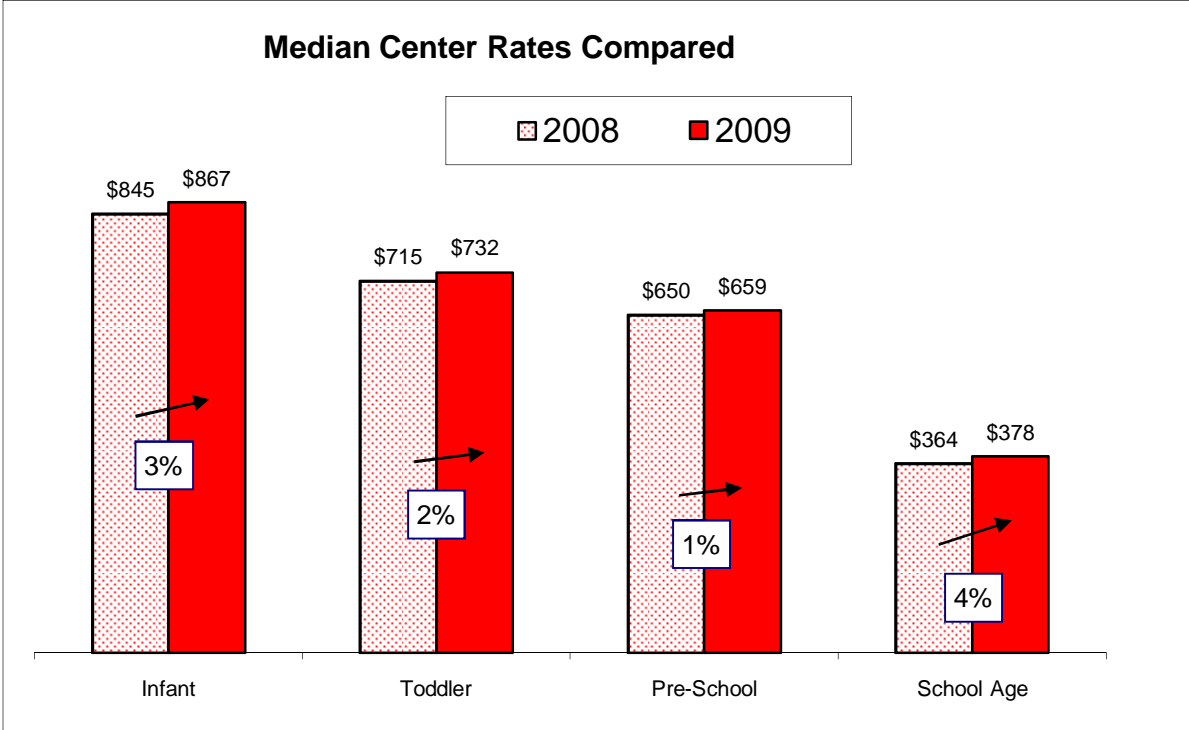
